<p>Legal framework in Slovakia in regard to administrative and criminal responsibility for activities that are banned under CCM includes following measures:</p> <p><b>1. Act No. 392/2011 Coll. – Act on Trading of Defence Related Products</b></p> <p><b>2. Act No. 300/2005 Coll. as amended – “Penal Code”</b></p>	<p>Special Act regulates conditions of trading with defence related products. Cluster munition falls under the term “defence related products” and the provisions of mentioned act does not allow the obtaining a license for the purpose of trading with cluster munition.</p>	<p>Slovak Penal Code does not explicitly contain the criminal offence under which the unlawful handling with cluster munition as stipulated in Art. 1 of CCM would be punishable. However, there are several criminal offences under which such illegal actions may be punishable. The criminal offences are divided into 12 chapters and relevant criminal offences are as follows:</p> <p><b>1. Breach of Regulations Governing the Handling of Controlled Goods and Technologies (CHAPTER FIVE: CRIMINAL OFFENCES AGAINST ECONOMY)</b></p>
