During training all military personnel are informed that Denmark, in accordance with the CCW, no longer uses anti personnel mines or booby-traps. All personnel – military as well as civilians - participating in observer missions, humanitarian, peacekeeping, and other operations, etc. have prior to their deployment, completed relevant mine awareness training.
