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LEGISLATION:

Italy ratified the CCW and the three annexed Protocols (I, II and III) with Law n. 715 of 14 December 1994 (entered into force on 20 January 1995). After that, with Law n. 290 of 30 July 1998, Amended Protocol II and Protocol IV were ratified (entered into force on 13 January 1999). Finally, with Law n. 173 of 12 November 2009 Italy ratified Protocol V of the CCW (entered into force on 11 February 2010).

Law n. 95/2011 authorised Italy's ratification of the Convention on Cluster Munitions.

The date of the Convention's entry into force for Italy was 1 March 2012.

Law n. 95/2011 modified the provisions related to the management of the Fund for Humanitarian Demining (established by Law n. 58/2001), allowing the funding of projects specifically related to cluster munition clearing, in addition to antipersonnel mines and explosive remnants of war.

Italian Armed Forces contingents operating in different international missions have recovered and destroyed the following explosive remnants of war:

- **Afghanistan:**
 - o 2 (two) 107mm rockets.

TECHNICAL COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE:

Demining and mine awareness courses to local armed and security forces:

- **Afghanistan:** 34 people trained on demining/mine awareness;
- **Lebanon:** 3 mine awareness courses and nr.2 mine risk education courses in favour to Lebanese civilians;
- **Iraq:** 6 C-IED courses, 1 Detect, Defeat, Tactical Site Exploitation and T3 courses and 1 C-IED Detect & Defeat Instructor course.
