**Steps taken to implement the provisions of Article 8:**

During the period covered by this report (2010), Sweden contributed about 90 million SEK to mine action. Most of this was channelled through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida). Projects supported by Sweden were directed mainly towards demining and awareness-raising in Afghanistan (Danish Demining Group-DDG), Iraq (DDG, Mines Advisory Group-MAG, the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency, MSB via ICRC), Sudan (DDG), Sri Lanka (DDG), DRC (MAG, MSB), Somalia (MSB via UNMAS), Western Sahara (MSB). Sida's support to the UN during 2010 consists of UNMAS core support and UNICEF (no cost extension of current agreement).

Included in the about 90 million SEK was a 200 000 SEK grant to ICBL-Landmine Monitor and 350 000 SEK to the secretariat of the Ottawa Treaty, ISU, from the Ministry for Foreign Affairs.

**Any other relevant information:**

In 1997, Sweden established the Swedish EOD and Demining Centre, SWEDEC, a centre for humanitarian demining as well as military mine clearance. SWEDEC is the country's focal point on technical matters, training, etc. Training courses are provided for internationals as support to Mine Actions, e.g.: Introduction to Mine Action; Introduction to IMAS; Operational planning with IMSMA; Technical Advisors; MRE; Socio Economic approaches to Mine Action etc. Students and facilitators from several countries have participated during the last year.

Sweden has a relatively large R&D programme.

Sweden also contributes to relevant IT (IMSMA) development for UNMAS through GICHD.

Sweden has since 1995 conducted or participated in 28 naval mine clearance operations within the territorial waters of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. In 2010 Sweden conducted a naval mine clearance operation within Swedish territorial waters solely based upon recommendations of the Baltic Ordnance Safety Board, BOSB

Swedish Armed Forces conduct ERW clearance during international Peace Support Operations, for example in Afghanistan.
