MINE CLEARANCE PROGRAMMES:

- a. Pakistan at present faces no problem of uncleared mines since no mines have been laid by Pakistan Army after escalation of 2001-2002 on Pakistan's Eastern border.
- b. Casualties have, however, occurred due to Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) used by the terrorists. During the period under reporting, a total of **518 x IED** attacks were attempted by terrorists all over the Country. Out of these, **262 x IEDs (50%) exploded** causing casualties.
- c. In order to ctr the menace of IEDs and protect the military and civil population from their harmful effectss; following significant national efforts have been put in by Pakistan:-
 - (1) **National Counter IED Forum** (involving Armed Forces, Civil Defence Organisation, Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) and Police) has been established to develop a dedicated and well-coordinated response to IED threat at National level.
 - (2) Establishment of **Counter IED, Explosives and Munitions School (CEMS)** to impart training by redesigning training curriculum in search, neutralization and disposal of IEDs on regular basis according to IED threat.
 - (3) **Capacity building of LEAs, Civil Defence Organisations and Police** is being carried out by furnishing these agencies with latest equipment and exceptional training at CEMS.
 - (4) Awareness to Amed Forces and civil departments through Monthly Assessment Reports and Quarterly Meetings.
