Currently no military personnel has been deployed abroad for the purpose of humanitarian mine clearance assistance.

International cooperation on mine clearance (in 2006)

In the year 2006 the Netherlands spent approximately 21.4 million EURO on mine action activities. An indicative overview of the Netherlands contributions to mine action (including stockpile-destruction) in the year 2006 in EURO is attached below.

A part of the Netherlands' assistance was provided for the care and rehabilitation, as well as social and economic reintegration of mine victims.

The total amount is somewhat higher than in previous years, mostly because of an incidental grant of EURO 4.150.000 to UNMAS Lebanon for mine, UXO and cluster bomb clearance in the aftermath of the Israel – Hezbollah conflict of August 2006.
