Within the period of 19 May and 8 June 2006, all 249 remotely controlled anti-personnel landmines previously retained by the National Army for the purpose of training were destroyed. The destruction of the 249 retained landmines was carried out in a safe designated area at the “Bulboaca Training Center”, by electric method, with respect of all environmental standards.
