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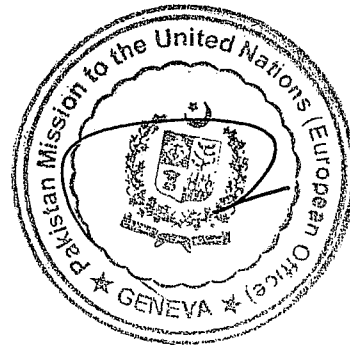

Steps taken to implement the provisions of Article 7:

No ERW exist in Pakistan. However, at times IEDs attacks by terrorists in FATA are reported as ERW. Therefore, a need exists to distinguish between ERW and sporadic IED incidents undertaken by the terrorists. During the period under report terrorists carried out 1200 IED attacks using different explosive materials including anti personnel and anti tank mines.

Steps taken to implement the provisions of Article 8:

Pakistan Army being amongst largest contributors to UN Peace Keeping Missions has been participating effectively in de-mining efforts in the past. Pakistan Army undertook de-mining operation in Kuwait, Cambodia and Angola as part of UN de-mining efforts. Pakistan Army also undertook de-mining operations in Sudan from May 2006 till termination of UNMIS (UN Mission in Sudan) in August 2011, clearing an area of 13,18,770 sq meter including detection and destruction of 1133 UXOs, 1626 ERWs and 226 anti personnel mines. During the period under reporting Pakistani Explosive Ordnance Teams in Liberia recovered and destroyed 351 UXOs and large quantity of small arms ammunition.

Pakistan would continue to provide all possible assistance for international de-mining efforts, within its capacity, in future as well.
