Form A

Dissemination of information

Article 13 / 4 / a

“The High Contracting Parties shall provide annual reports to the Depository ... on ...:

(a) dissemination of information on this Protocol to their armed forces and to the civilian population;”

Information to the armed forces

The appropriate doctrine, operational and training publications and courses of instruction of the armed forces of the Hellenic Republic have been revised as necessary to incorporate the requirements of Amended Protocol II. The interpretation of the provisions of the Protocol and their practical implementation has become part of the training the armed forces of the Hellenic Republic receive in International Humanitarian Law and the Law of War.

Specific units and personnel of particular specialties receive extended instructions.

Information to the civilian population

The law by which the Hellenic Parliament ratified Amended Protocol II was published in the Official Government Gazette on November 03, 1998 and is, therefore, in the public domain. The general population of the Hellenic Republic has also been informed

through the national press that Hellas also ratified the CCW and its Protocols and signed & ratified the 1997 Ottawa Convention.

Form B **Mine clearance and rehabilitation programmes**

(b) mine clearance and rehabilitation programmes;”

Mine clearance programmes

A huge ERW clearance is still under way in vast areas of Western Macedonia and Ipiros in the North-West part of the Hellenic Republic, in “suspect areas” containing Explosive Remnants of War dating from World War II and the 1946-1949 era. There are no properly defined minefields in this area and no maps, the number of dangerous devices to be removed is very large and the weather conditions are adverse for the most part of the year, resulting in the very slow progress of works. It is worth mentioning that the “suspect areas” to be cleared and secured in the mountains of Grammos and Vitsi alone, measure well over 40.000 hectares. — .

From 1st January until 31st December 2011, 525.155 m2 were cleared and secured in the above area.

Rehabilitation programmes

There are no mine victims . (**Note:** All minefields along the border with Turkey in the Evros Province are clearly defined and marked,

well above any standard established by Amended Protocol II and the relevant NATO STANAGs, since 20 th July 2009 all antipersonnel mines have been removed.)

Form C

Technical requirements

Hellas has taken all the steps necessary to meet the technical requirements of the Protocol. All mines, booby-traps and other devices in the inventory of the Hellenic armed forces comply fully with the technical provisions of Amended Protocol II.

Article 13 / 4 / d

Legislation

Amended Protocol II was ratified by law 2652/98, published in issue numb. 249 of the Official Government Gazette on November 03, 1998, and thus became *part of the internal Hellenic legislation* according to the relevant provision of the Constitution. No other legislation is required to enable the Hellenic Republic to carry out its obligations under the Protocol.

The Hellenic Republic also ratified the CCW and its Protocols I, II and III by law 1979/91, published in issue numb. 186 of the Official Government Gazette on December 09, 1991. Protocol IV was ratified by law 2484/97, published in issue 75 of the Official Government Gazette on May 16, 1997. — The Ottawa Convention (MBT) was ratified by law 2999/02, published in issue 71 of the Official Government Gazette on April 08, 2002 and came into force on April 25, 2003.

Form E **International technical information exchange, cooperation on mine clearance, technical cooperation and assistance**

Article 13 / 4 / e “The High Contracting Parties shall provide annual reports to the Depository ... on ...:
(e) measures taken on international technical information exchange, on international cooperation on mine clearance, and on technical cooperation and assistance;”

International technical information exchange

The Hellenic Republic participated in the all the recent meetings of the Standing Committees of the Ottawa Convention, namely in the meetings of the Committees for “mine clearance, mine awareness and mine action technologies” and “stockpile destruction”.

International cooperation on mine clearance

In 2004, the MFA of the Hellenic Republic provided the Greek NGO "IMI" with 1.9 million euros for demining operations in Iraq and Lebanon. In 2003 the MFA provide the same NGO with 4,4 million euros for demining in Iraq, Lebanon and Bosnia& Herzegovina.

International cooperation and assistance

The Hellenic Republic takes part in the Joint Action of the EU Member States providing financial and technical assistance to landmine victims and affected countries.

Other relevant matters

The Hellenic Republic does not manufacture, import or export mines.

The Multinational Peace Support Operations Training Centre (MPSOTC) near the city of Kilkis in Macedonia, northern Hellas —established in 1998 and subordinated to the Hellenic National Defence General Staff— offers high level theoretical and practical education & training in PSOs and International Humanitarian Law, to personnel (officers, NCOs & troops) of the Hellenic armed forces as well as of the armed forces of various other countries of South-Eastern Europe.

The Hellenic Army basically employs manual mine clearance. International practices and standards in mine clearance are followed.
– Canine detection is also employed in certain circumstances.
– Robot mine clearance systems (mini flail) has been purchased.
